(Maple Knoll) 5 stars - Big Shout Out!! to Maple Knoll Apartments Westfield. These apartments are beautiful and very well maintained. Neighbors are quiet. They offer lots of different floor plans for 1, 2 and 3 bedrooms. The apartments are updated, spacious, nice appliances and fixtures, and nice size patio or balconies depending on which apartment you choose. This is what building relationships looks like: (Brookside)

Week#1: Studying with Brianna and talking about what it means to be a good steward of your time when you're a busy person, but also want people to know that they can call on you.

Dale came to church with us on Sunday!

Evan: I don't know how we got on the subject of dying, but Evan and I had a great conversation about how dying is insanely terrible (I think we were talking about how his dad has cancer-we know about his dad, but his friends don't even know). I told Evan that I couldn't imagine losing Ryan, but that my belief in God and trust in Jesus Christ saves me from much more excruciating pain. Roy is a 90 year old man who is open about his sorrow of being a widower. Evan and I chatted about that I told him that Roy teaches me a lot as my elder, but one thing I have learned NOT to do from him, is to set my spouse on a pedestal and get depressed over their being gone, because I know Ryan would be in heaven and happier than I ever could have made him. Evan clearly wasn't having it and we went on talking about other things and I left shortly after. We pray for him often.

Kelly: I picked her up and we went to go read at Starbucks and we were both reading worldview/psychology books, mine was Christian and hers secular. We got to share the things we were learning and see how they were different. I am praying for her. We can't talk about this too often though because she gets worn out and I don't get to see her for long periods of time.

We also had community group!

Week #2: We stop in often at the office and see what's going on. Mainly we like to say hello and be there with them because we all like each other. I spent time with Brianna and Kelly again. This was a harder week to get with people because it surrounded Valentine's Day. We didn't have Community group this week.

Week #3: Again, we have Community group every week. This is a time on Tuesday nights that we open the clubhouse and a group of Christians come in and we read and talk about the Bible, share prayer requests and pray over one another. I hung out with Brianna for a bit and we always text our friends in the complex to see how they're doing and if they are free to get together with us. We both went to the Community Life Meeting the month at the Meadows.

Week #4: Our last week was difficult in Building relationships. We did more texting that face to face. We don't like that, but when we can't get together often, that's what we have to engage in. We also didn't see the staff often considering Evan, our manager, is basically doing all the jobs. But we did spend enough time with him to know that Pam, the assistant manager, has been "sick" very often and this time she was "sick" for an entire week. Every week I have been studying with Brianna on Thursday afternoons once I get out of class and I babysat 3 tiny and beautiful girls on Friday and brought them by the apartment complex office. Evan said that they made his day and he made theirs with candy and goldfish!

Though this all happened, I thought I would also mention that I got together with an old resident. She was struggling in the complex and she could really drain me of love, care, and counsel. She left the apartment complex to pursue a trip with YWAM. She came back such a glowing person. The Lord had really changed her and she brought me back gifts and thanked us for all our hospitality. We used to let her do laundry at our house to help her save money, we let her use our Wi-Fi, fed her often, let her come over without warning and many other things. She was honestly hard to be around, but God has molded her into someone wonderful.
